It also registered in FBR as a non-profit organization and the license is renewed every year. It is working on donations, sadqat, zakat and lillah. Since its formation, in 2017, it has tried to improve the conditions of people by participating in different socio-economic activities and create a positive impact on communities

In exercise of the powers vested in me under sub-clause (c) of clause (36) of section 2 of the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001 read with Rules 212 and 220 of the Income Tax Rules, 2002, the application of M/S. SYED FOUNDATION, bearing NTN: 6794091, for grant of status of non- profit organization is, hereby, provisionally approved subject to fulfillment of the following conditions:

- i) The taxpayer shall submit Performance Evaluation Report (PER) when received from the Pakistan Centre for Philanthropy or Chief Commissioner Inland Revenue..
- ii) This approval does not make the applicant organization eligible for grant of exemption per se with respect to any income generated from any business activity carried on by the said organization.
- iii) This approval is NOT VALID for claiming exemption from withholding tax u/s 148 of the ITO, 2001 on import of goods and services.
- iv.. This approval is subject to the condition that the Trust has not been or is being used for personal gain of any particular person or a group of persons; or has been or is being managed in a manner calculated to personally benefit its members or their families.
- v. The organization can avail this approval until it is able to achieve its declared aims and objects in view of its set up, administration or otherwise and comply to other conditions mentioned in Rule 213 of Income Tax Rules 2022

This approval is valid upto 30-06-2023 unless cancelled or revoked earlier because of non-fulfillment of any of the prescribed conditions including the above.

ACTIVITIES DONE BY SYED FOUNDATION:

The canvas of activities of Syed Foundation has been diversified and multifaceted. Arranging lunches, distribution of grocery and flour bags, providing medicines and help in other health related facilities, educational support and scholarships, service of qurbani and sadqa, Ramdan and Eid Celebrations etc. Syed Foundation has been accomplishing these tasks with high degree of integration and dedication.

The dynamic nature of the range of social services done by Syed Foundation is as follows:



• FOOD DRIVES:

Syed Foundation conducted food drives every week on Sunday all year round at institutions where people are residing such as Darul Sukun center for old people, IdaRieu School for Blind and Deaf and Aashiyana House. Moreover, lunch was arranged at different places in Karachi such as Mehran Town, Gulistan-e-Johar, Lyari, Bahria Town for labors and other roadside areas, hence catering more than 11000 people all year round of up to Rs. 1,950,000/-











• <u>DISTRIBUTION OF GROCERY AND FLOUR BAGS:</u>

Grocery bags worth of Rs. 5,000/- were given every month to families in Karachi, as a help due to rising inflation, making it total of Rs. 2,160,000/-



Other than this, 100 Flour Bags of 10 kg each were distributed to help poverty stricken families every month.

• HELP FOR COOLIES AT RAILWAY STATION:

The flood situation in the interior areas of Sindh affected a lot of people, including Coolies at the railway station, Karachi. They were deprived of basic necessity such as food, as the trains did not function for over two months. Syed Foundation, along with its supporters, and in collaboration with Alamgir Welfare Trust International, arranged lunch along with grocery bags and distributed to 150 coolies worth of Rs. 400,000/-






• EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS:

Education is the key for success. Hence as part of humanitarian need, along with growth and success of individuals and economy at large Syed Foundation has provided need based scholarships to 49 students, getting their education in different schools of Karachi. SF has been covering tuition fees ranging from Rs. 600/- to Rs. 10,000/-, along with providing help in terms of payment of admission fees, annual fees and examination fees to underprivileged children, thus giving them opportunity to build a better future for themselves and their families.



From July 2022 to June'2023, admission fees of Rs. 120,000/- was paid for different students at school level and for a nursing course at Hamdard University. Furthermore, semester fees was paid for students of NED University and KASBIT. Moreover, examination fees, annual charges and previously unpaid tuition fees was cleared for the students, totaling up to Rs. 40,000/-.



The students supported by SF are studying at various schools such as Quill Grammar School, IqraTaj School, Magnanimous Schooling, Unique University, Foremoist School, M.D Public School, Little Flower Children Academy, House of Learning and S.M Public School.

Other than this, students were given stationary boxes, course books and uniforms in start of academic year, according to their respective classes, worth of Rs. 61,845/-

With the help of NISA Help Foundation, tuition fees of Rs, 592,610/- was paid for 190 students studying in various schools on Karachi and Tharparker.

• MEDICAL AID:

One of the primary objectives of Syed Foundation is to provide help to individuals in terms of distribution of medicines, clearing hospital bills, help in operations etc.

Two wheel chairs and one hospital bed was given bed-ridden patients belonging to needy families and to Darul Sukun Center in order to help handicapped children. Other than this Rs. 134,520/- was given to various impoverished people to support them in buying medicines and get their medical tests done, as prescribed. Other this SF assisted in operation of various individuals by providing them with financial aid upto Rs. 330,000/- and also helped in providing concession of Rs, 2,500,000/- in operation of a cancer patient at Aga



Khan University Hospital with help of The Behbud Society for Patients at Aga Khan University Hospital.

SF provides a financial aid of Rs. 25,000/- every month to Omair Sana Welfare Foundation, a well-known organization treating Thalassemia patients, and also supports a speciallyable girl at Islamic Medical Center, Rawalpindi.

Due to rise in Dengue cases in Karachi, after the devastating flood, 180 Mosquito repellants were distributed as a precautionary measure in families residing in low-lying areas and to orphanages, schools and old houses such as Darul Sukun, Idareiu School, Silverline School for Blind, Aashiyana Trust and Magnanimous School.

• FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE:

Syed Foundation supports poverty-stricken families during times of inflation. For this, financial aid of Rs. 828,500/- all year round. Other than this, Rs. 213,730/- were given, in collaboration with NISA Help Foundation to support different families.

• RAMADAN PROJECT:

It is encouraged to give charity during the month of Ramadan to show compassion and help for the poor and less fortunate people of our society. Charity is beneficial for those who receive it, and there are great rewards for those who give it. This year, with help of valuable donors, Syed Foundation was able to meet needs of people at our full capacity by conducting food drives, distribution grocery bags and eid dresses, carrying out activities as part of sawab-e-jaria, and creating self-employment opportunities. Mentioned below are details of all the activities done during Holy month of Ramadan.

★ <u>IFTAR-DINNER</u> served to 8700 people, cost of which was estimated to be around Rs. 1,020,500/-, in different centers of Karachi such as Darul Sukun Old House, Darul Sukun Centre for Special Children, Idareieu School for Blind and Deaf, Aashiyana



House and also for the labors working at Bahria Town. Moreover iftar was also served to people on roadsides in Karachi in areas of Shaheed-e-Millat, Orangi, Korangi, Liaquatabad, Akhter Colony and Model Town.

Moreover, Iftar-Dinner was served in Shafi Masjid, Gulaothi and other areas of Pakistan such as Hala, Badin, Tharparkar, Mityari, Sinjhoro, Rawalpindi, Quetta, Peshawar, Chitral and Gilgit.

- ❖ GROCERY BAGS were distributed among 1670 poverty-stricken families, out of which 1164 bags were distributed in Karachi, 60 bags in Rawalpindi, 10 bags in Peshawar among families associated with welfare of disable association, 6 bags in Sukkur, 30 bags in Lahore and 400 bags in interior of Sindh that were affected by flood 2022. The cost of bags estimated to be Rs. 8,082,500/-
- ❖ <u>EID DRESSES</u> worth of Rs. 218,730/- was distributed among children affected by flood and families residing in Karachi.
- ❖ **SEWING MACHINES** worth of Rs. 1,337,500/- were distributed among women to promote self-employment and in Industrial Homes of Korangi, where the valuable stitiching skill is being taught. The number of sewing machines distributed was 107, and it was done in collaboration of Voice of Blind and Iqbal Hyderi Foundation.
- **❖ ANIMAL SHEDS** were constructed in Tando Allayar to save the animals from the scorching heat of sun.
- ❖ <u>SAWAB-E-JARIA</u> activities were also carried out during this Ramadan, which include giving of 3 wheel chairs to Disable Welfare Association, giving financial aid for the construction of mosque, in collaboration of Alamgir Welfare Trust International in Scheme 33, Karachi and construction of one hand pump in Sanghar, so people get access of clean water.



- ❖ **SADQA** was done of 4 goats and the meat was distributed among poor families.
- ❖ **FINANCIAL AID** of Rs. 145,500/- was given to 12 families to help them meet both ends during these crucial times.
- **MEDICAL AID** was given in terms of provision of medicines worth of Rs. 20,000/- and helping an old needy lady to conduct her Lab tests of Rs. 10,000/- . Moreover, Concession worth of Rs. 2,000,000/- was given for assistance in operation for a cancer patient in AKUH, in collaboration of The Behbud Society for Patients.
- ❖ <u>IN KIND DONATION</u> was given to different families and institutions working for welfare of people. Things distributed were 100 lit Oil. 925 kg flour, 1750 kg rice, 125 kg potatoes and onions, 250 kg tea, 48 bottles of Rooh Afza and 9000 kg of dates.
- **★ SMART TV** was installed in Darul Sukun Old House, as a recreation activity for senior citizens.



































• **EID CELEBRATIONS:**

Syed Foundation celebrated Eid with special children at Darul Sukun centre. Lunch was arranged for the children and goody bags with eatables were distributed among them, which spread smiles and joys among the children. Moreover lunch and sweets (mithae) was arranged for the senior citizens residing at Darul Sukun Center and Aashiyana House. Sweets were distributed among the school going children residing in Saddar and Orangi.















• <u>IJTIMAE QURBANI:</u>

Every year, Syed Foundation provides the service of Ijtimae Qurbani, especially for our overseas members. This year, SF was able to distribute meat of 10 goats and 54 shares of cow among families residing low lying areas such as Gadap Town, Lyari, New Karachi, Orangi, Mehmoodabad, Kharadar and ground staff of sports centers. Other than this, meat was also given to institutions like Darul Sukun and Idareiu School.





• FLOOD RELIEF WORK:

Pakistan has been drenched by monsoon rain, resulting in urban and flash flooding along with land sliding and glacier outburst flow in all four provinces of Pakistan. As a result 81 districts, from total 4 provinces, were officially declared calamity-hit. As part of relief activities, steps of Syed Foundation were devised on the basis of humanitarian crisis that emerged in those areas. The cost incurred in whole flood relief process, so far is **Rs**. **10,766,321/-**.The relief activities was carried out in different areas of Sindh (Larkana, Tando Muhammad Khan, TandoAllayar, Dadu, Sanghar, Kashmore, Sukkur, Shikarpur) and Balochistan (Uthal and Lasbela)

Below is a summary of work done, followed by details of each work.



- Provided 270 tents and Tarpaulin Sheets and to help them in accommodation.
- Distribution of 9000 boxes of cooked meals, 2100 grocery packs, 1750 kg of flour, 1200 kg Rice, 25 kg lentils, 500 kg White Chanay and 240 ltr Oil along with nutritional packets among flood victims.
- Setting up of 9 Medical Camps in different areas of Sindh, to control the outbreak of diseases such as Dengue, Malaria, Typhoid and Cholera etc. More than 3500 people were benefitted from these camps.
- Arranged 41 water tankers, benefitting 12300 people, along with provision of 2200 jerry cans and 100 water coolers, to ensure access of clean drinking water.
- Fumigation spray was done which in 4 villages to control outbreak of vector borne diseases. Moreover 1400 Mosquito Repellant Nets, 150 Coils and 3500+ Mosquito repellants were distributed.
- 2 Pit Latrines were installed in displaced camps to ensure sanitation. Hygiene and maintain privacy.
- 1850 Hygiene Kits were distributed which include Bonus detergent, Palmolive soap, Max Bar dishwashing soap, Colgate Sparkle tooth paste, tooth brush, comb and nail cutter.
- 150 Learning kits were distributed to ensure that education is continued even in hard times.
- 100 Kitchen utensil bags were distributed which included Tawa, Tashla, Cooking Pots and Spoons, Plates, Glass, Spoon, Detergent and Dishwashing Soap.
- 1800 Dignity kits were distributed among women and girls comprising of 2 boxes of pads, undergarments, 1 detergent, 6 pcs towels and 2 pcs hand washing soap. Moreover awareness sessions were also conducted in various areas.
- Distributed of new and pre-loved clothes and slippers among the flood victims.
- 800+ blankets along with woolen chadars were distributed to mitigate the sufferings during winter season
- Chickens (Hens) were provided to 50 vulnerable families, so they could sustain and use these as a source for employment



- 8 Houses, worth of Rs. 1,600,000/- were constructed for displaced families. This is one of the vital step for the rehabilitation of flood-affected people.

• <u>SEMINAR ON BREAST CANCER:</u>

A seminar was held in Sindh Madrassatul Islam University for awareness of breast cancer, conducted by Prof. Dr. Rufina Soomro, in collaboration with POA Women Commision and KSF.









• INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION (14TH AUGUST):

Syed Foundation ceebrated their Independence Day celebration by cutting cake at Aashiyana Trust and Darul Sukun Old House. Additionally, gifts were given on account of contest at held at NJV School, adopted by Akhuwat Foundation. Moreover accessories such as flags and headbands, along with balloons were distributed at Darul Sukun for Special Children, as part of their celebrations. A celebration was also done in collaboration with Hope Welfare for thalassemia patients. Lastly, dinner was served to the team of House of Learning and Lyari Entrepreneurial Camp, who spent their entire day collecting funds for welfare of students.

• BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION OF SYED FOUNDATION:

November marks 6 years, since formation of Syed Foundation. On account of this, small celebrations was done at various places, with which we are associated since beginning. Cake cutting ceremony was done with the students of magnanimous school, followed by distribution of chocolates, candies and lollipops among special children at Darul Sukun. Moreover, fruits were distributed and enjoyed by children and senior citizens at Darul Sukun Old House, Aashiyana Trust, Idareiu School and Silverline School.







• WHITE CANE DAY:

On 15th October, White Cane Day (Blind Day) was celebrated at Mazar-e-Quaid in collaboration with Voice of Blind and Silverline School for Blind. Juices and water bottles was distributed among the children, in collaboration with Voice of Blind.



• FACILITY OF DOING SADQA:

Syed Foundation provides service of doing Sadqa in form of either slaughtering of animal or provision of grocery bags. Since July, **30 goats** have been slaughtered, and the meat was distributed to poor people.



• PROMOTING SELF-EMPLOYMENT:

In order to promote self-employment, a rickshaw worth of **Rs. 360,000/-** was given to a needy person, so he can earn living for his family, in collaboration with 70F Friends of Humanity Foundation. Other than this sewing machines were given to encourage self-employment and empowerment.

• **DISTRIBUTION OF BLANKETS:**

Due to harsh weather conditions, blankets, warm clothes, shawls, woolen chadars were distributed on roadsides and among residents of Lyari, Orangi, Korangi, security staff of educational institutions Sports Centers and Complexes such as Jehangir Khan Squash Comlex and Silverline School in Karachi. Other than this, the winter drive was successfully done in Quetta and Lahore as well.







• RELIEF EFFORTS FOR EARTHQUAKE IN SYRIA AND TURKEY:

With the contributions of dear members, SF was able to send 160 blankets to Syria via NDMA, and 704 blankets along with 1134 packets of milk to Turkey via BaitusSalam Trust, in collaboration with 70F Friends of Humanity Foundation.



• CONTRIBUTION TO OTHER SECTORS:

Some other work done by Syed Foundation is as follows:

- Provide financial assistance in a Tadfeen.
- * Rs. 94,000/- were given to different families as part of assistance in wedding.
- ❖ Cartons of milk were distributed at Darul Sukun Old House.
- ❖ Disposable crockery was given at Darul Sukun, Kashmir Road
- Cerelac and Porridge are being supplied on monthly basis, as part of breakfast, for special children at Darul Sukun on monthy basis.
- Stationary Material were given at Darul Sukun Centre, Kashmir Road, as part of their school art work.
- ❖ Mattress was given to an orphan, during winters.
- ❖ Women day event was organized at Darul Sukun centre.
- Contributed in the picnic for the children at Darul Sukun at DANZOO, Bahria Town.

Since its formation, Syed Foundation has been working effortlessly for the betterment of people. Being aware of all the local problems and challenges faced by people, the main focus is on development, empowerment, help, and turning the poor and underprivileged citizens into champions by contributing in making life for them.
