V. <u>BALUCHISTAN:</u>

- In partnership with Alamgir Welfare Trust International we arranged iftar dinner for 100 needy individuals throughout Ramadan in area Bhag Nadi which is the most backward city of Baluchistan facing extreme poverty.
- In partnership with Research and development foundation we arranged iftar dinner for 38 underprivileged individuals in Quetta.

2. GROCERY DRIVE

I. <u>GROCERY BAGS:</u>

As part of our commitment to supporting vulnerable communities during the holy month of Ramadan, a comprehensive grocery bag distribution initiative was implemented. This report provides a detailed overview of the distribution process and the impact achieved through our collective efforts.

• **Distribution Summary:**

- Total Grocery Bags Distributed: 1,833 Bags.
- Total Monetary Worth: Rs. 11,230,000/-
- Breakdown of Distribution:
 - Received in kind donation of 20 bags each having worth of approximately Rs.10,000/-. Ten of these bags were distributed among individuals like maids, driver and guards in Karachi whereas remaining ten were sent to Darul Sukun Old House.
 - 378 Grocery Vouchers worth Rs. 3,000/-, 390 Grocery Vouchers worth Rs. 5,000/and 154 Grocery Vouchers worth Rs. 7,000/- of Chase Up all branches were distributed among various individuals, including underprivileged families, Drivers, Maids, Security Guards etc. By providing recipients with the flexibility to purchase essential groceries according to their specific needs, the initiative empowered individuals and families to meet their dietary requirements with dignity and choice. This effort aimed to provide essential support to those who work tirelessly but may struggle to make ends meet. By extending our assistance in this manner, we hope to alleviate some of the financial burdens faced by these members of our community.
 - We distributed 45 grocery bags at a total cost of Rs. 1,315,350/-, along with 12 additional grocery bags costing Rs. 156,500/-, among needy individuals in Islamabad. These bags were filled with essential food items, aimed at providing sustenance and support to those facing economic hardship. This initiative aimed to





alleviate some of the financial burdens faced by individuals and families in our community, ensuring they have access to nutritious food during challenging times.

- Fifty grocery bags, each valued at Rs. 6,175/-, were distributed among various needy individuals in Karachi, including maids, servants, drivers, and house help. These bags were filled with essential food items to cater to their immediate needs. This initiative aimed to provide practical support to those who play vital roles in our daily lives but may struggle financially. By extending assistance in this manner, we sought to alleviate some of the challenges faced by these members of our community.
- A total of 700 grocery bags, each valued at Rs. 7,100/-, were distributed among various individuals in Karachi, particularly targeting the needy and underprivileged members of the community. This large-scale distribution aimed to provide essential sustenance to those facing economic challenges, ensuring they have access to basic necessities. Through this initiative, we endeavored to make a meaningful impact on the lives of the less fortunate in our city.
- Distributed grocery bags having worth of Rs.30,000/- among the 8 needy families in Nathiagali.
- In partnership with RDF we were able to distribute 76 grocery bags to the needy families of Tando Allahyar, Hyderabad, Badin, Tando Muhammad Khan, Mirpurkhas, Sujawal and Quetta. The cost of each bag was Rs. 2,265/-, thus making the whole project worth of Rs.172,410/-.

II. FLOUR DISTRIBUTION:

The flour distribution initiative undertaken during the month of Ramadan aimed to address food insecurity and support vulnerable communities. This report provides a detailed overview of the distribution process and outcomes achieved through our collective efforts.

• **Distribution Summary:**

- Total Flour Distributed: 38,172 kg.
- Total Monetary Worth: Rs. 5,725,800/-
- Breakdown of Contributions:
 - Distributed 20 bags of flour, each weighing 5kg, among the low-income households in Islamabad.
 - In response to the pressing needs of underprivileged communities in Karachi, a comprehensive distribution initiative was implemented to provide essential sustenance in the form of flour. We were able to distribute 700 bags of flour, each having weight of 10kg, among the low-poverty, underprivileged and needy families across Karachi.
 - In addition to the direct distribution initiative, it's important to acknowledge our collaboration with Aabroo Educational Welfare Organization flour drive. Our

contribution of 25,000 rupees facilitated the procurement of approximately 32 bags of 5 kg flour, which further supplemented the overall effort to address food insecurity among vulnerable communities in Punjab. This collaborative approach underscores the importance of partnership and collective action in tackling socio-economic challenges effectively.

- Acknowledging our involvement in supporting the "Sasta Bazaar" organized by the Khas Foundation during the month of Ramazan is crucial. Our contribution of Rs.6,500/- facilitated the purchase of 40 kg of flour, which contributed to the accessibility of essential food items for individuals and families during this auspicious month.
- 100 bags of 10kg flour were distributed among the needy families registered with Aabroo Educational Welfare Organization.

III. <u>RICE DISTRIBUTION</u>

As part of our commitment to supporting vulnerable communities during the month of Ramadan, a rice distribution initiative was implemented. This report provides an overview of the rice distribution process and the impact achieved through our efforts.

• **Distribution Summary:**

- Total Rice Distributed: 260 kg
- Total Monetary Worth: Rs. 52,000/-

• Breakdown of Distribution:

- Contributed to the welfare efforts of Essas-e-Bashar NGO by providing 10 kg of rice to support their initiatives aimed at assisting vulnerable communities.
- We supported the "Sasta Bazaar" organized by the Khas Foundation by donating 50 kg of rice, further enhancing accessibility to essential food items for individuals and families in need.
- 100 bags of 2kg rice were distributed among the needy families registered with Aabroo Educational Welfare Organization.

IV. <u>OIL:</u>

We received a generous in-kind donation of oil, which played a pivotal role in supporting various institutions and individuals in need during the month of Ramadan. This report outlines the details of the donation received and the distribution process undertaken to ensure its equitable dissemination.

V. DATES:

As part of our commitment to supporting individuals and families during the month of Ramadan, a distribution initiative for dates was undertaken. This report outlines the details of the distribution process and the impact achieved through our efforts.

• **Distribution Summary:**

- Total Date Packets Distributed: 112 (1 kg each)
- Total Monetary Worth: Rs. 856,000/-.

• Breakdown of Distribution:

• The distribution of 100 packets of 1 kg dates, valued at Rs. 850,000/-, played a significant role in providing essential nutrition and spiritual sustenance to individuals and families in Islamabad. By targeting low-poverty families and needy individuals in Islamabad, we ensured that the dates reached those who needed them most, fostering a sense of community and support during the holy month.





- Our contribution of 2 kg of dates to Esas-e-Bashar NGO facilitated the provision of iftar meals for those in need, further extending the reach of our efforts to promote solidarity and compassion.

VI. <u>ROOH-AFZA DISTRIBUTION:</u>

As part of our efforts to support individuals and families during the month of Ramadan, we initiated a distribution of RoofAfza, a refreshing drink. This report provides an overview of the distribution process and the impact achieved through our efforts

• **Distribution Summary**:

- Total Rooh-Afza Bottles Distributed: 186 Bottles.
- Total Cost: Rs. 74,400/-
- Breakdown of Distribution:
 - We donated 90 bottles whereas received 24 bottles as In-kind Donation.
 - Distributed these bottles among the Sasta Bazaar (Khas Foundation), RDFs for distribution among needy families across Sindh and Aashiyana Trust (Old House for Women).
 - Distributed the bottles among individuals in Karachi who are needy and are observing Fasts (Roza) in Ramadan.
 - Distributed 24 bottles of Rooh-Afza among the students at Madrassa in Abbotabad.
 - Distributed 48 bottles of Rooh-Afza among the deserving families in Nathiagali observing fast.

In support of individuals and families observing Ramadan, a vegetable distribution initiative was undertaken to provide essential ingredients for nutritious meals. This report outlines the details of the distribution process and the impact achieved through our efforts.

• **Distribution Summary:**

- Total Vegetable Bags Distributed: 75 Bags.
- Total Cost : Rs. 36,000/-.

• Contents of Each Bag:

- 2 kg Potatoes.
- 1 kg Onions.





The vegetable bags were distributed across Karachi among low-income households to ensure that individuals and families had access to essential ingredients for preparing meals during Ramadan. By providing potatoes and onions, staple ingredients for many dishes, we ensured that recipients had the necessary resources to prepare nutritious meals, thereby enhancing their Ramadan experience and promoting overall well-being.

VIII. SEWING MACHINE:

In an effort to promote self-employment and empower individuals, a distribution initiative for swing machines was undertaken during the month of Ramadan. This report provides details of the distribution process and the impact achieved through our collaborative efforts.

• Distribution Summary:

- Total Swing Machines Distributed: 56 Machines.
- Total Cost: Rs. 699,000/-.
- Breakdown of Distribution:
 - Directly Distributed some machines to individuals in Karachi including maids, tailor and Dar ul Sukun Old House.
 - In collaboration with Iqbal Haidri Foundation 10 machines were donated to deserving individual with the aim to provide the means to generate income and achieve self-empowerment.

The success of the swing machine distribution initiative reflects our commitment to fostering economic empowerment and self-sufficiency among individuals, particularly during Ramadan. Moving forward, it is essential to continue supporting initiatives that promote entrepreneurship and self-employment, leveraging partnerships and resources to create lasting positive change in the lives of those we serve.











3. FIDYA:

In response to the generous contribution of Rs. 137,415/- received as FIDYA from our donors, a decision was made to allocate this amount to Alamgir Welfare Trust International. The allocated funds are used by Alamgir Welfare Trust International to procure ration bags for distribution among needy individuals. This initiative aims to alleviate food insecurity and support vulnerable communities in accessing essential sustenance during times of need. By entrusting the funds to a reputable organization with a track record of serving the community, we ensure that the donation reaches those who need it most, promoting inclusivity and support within society.

4. **FITRA:**

We've received Rs.86,000/- from our compassionate donors as Fitra. These contributions have been pivotal in facilitating our Iftaar/dinner program, providing sustenance to those in need during the sacred month of Ramadan.

Through the collective efforts of our donors and volunteers, we have been able to foster an environment of compassion and solidarity, exemplifying the spirit of giving that defines Ramadan.





5. EID CLOTHES:

In celebration of Eid and as part of our commitment to supporting deserving individuals, a distribution initiative for Eid clothes was undertaken.

- The total Cost of Eid Clothes purchased was Rs. 454,750/-. The Eid clothes were distributed among deserving individuals in Karachi, including guards, maids, drivers, gardeners, and individuals associated with organizations such as Bait-ul-Islam Cancer Hospital Guards, Ashiyana Trust, Khas Foundation, and Blind School in North Nazimabad.
- Sent the Eid clothes for deserving individuals living in different cities of Pakistan including Charsadda, Nathiagali and Kalaam.
- Sent Eid clothes to Aabroo welfare Organization so that they distribute them among deserving individuals in Lahore.
- Contributed Rs.25,000/- with RDF, so that underprivileged people living across Sindh get the Eid clothes.

The distribution of Eid clothes aimed to bring joy and celebration to deserving individuals and families, particularly during the festive occasion of Eid. By providing new clothes, we sought to uplift spirits and enhance the Eid experience for those in need, fostering a sense of belonging and inclusion within the community.







6. SOLAR PANEL AT MASJID:

As part of our commitment to Sadqa-e-Jariah, a concept of ongoing charity in Islam, we undertook the installation of a solar panel in a Masjid. The total Cost for its installation was Rs. 175,000/-. The installation of the solar panel not only provides immediate benefits to the Masjid in terms of energy efficiency and cost savings but also serves as a long-term investment in sustainability. By reducing reliance on conventional energy sources, the initiative contributes to mitigating environmental impact and promoting a greener future.

7. SADQAH:

4 goats having worth of Rs.44,000/- were slaughtered and their meat was distributed among needy individuals.

8. HANDPUMPS:

We have successfully completed the installation of 70 handpumps with a total worth f Rs.1,750,000/- in collaboration with Alamgir Welfare Trust International. In the month of Ramadan the installation process of four handpumps worth of Rs. 100,000/- has commenced, bringing us one step closer to providing clean and safe drinking water to communities in need.







9. PALESTINE AID PROJECT:

- In partnership with 70F Friends of Humanity and Al Khidmat Foundation we have sent 2000 kg of ready to eat food and 2,200kg Rice for our Palestinian brothers and sisters. The total project had cost of Rs.2,000,000/- .
- Sent 10,000 sanitary napkins for our Palestinian sisters, received as in-kind donation.











10.FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE:

- Financial aid of Rs. 40,000/- was given to support 3 needy families.
- Contributed Rs. 10,000/- with Khas Foundation to setup a confectionary cart for a needy individual.
- Contributed wool, needles, and frames for ladies at Darul Sukun Old House Karachi.







11.MEDICAL ASSISTANCE:

- Generously donated Rs. 111,000/- towards the patient's bone marrow transplant operation, making a tangible difference in the journey towards recovery and wellbeing.
- Donated medicine of worth Rs.5,180/- to underprivileged patient, thus supporting healthcare initiatives and trying to improve the well-being of individuals.

12.EDUCATION:

To alleviate the financial burden for a student studying at Hamdard University, the semester fee of Rs. 50,000/- was fully covered, reaffirming the commitment to nurturing talent and supporting educational aspirations.

13.EID CELEBRATION:

On 14th April, Syed Foundation had the honor of celebrating Eid with disabled children at the Darul Sukun Institute. This event was a testament to the organization's commitment to spreading joy and inclusivity among marginalized communities.
