Some of the challenges faced by poverty-stricken families include inaccessible of food and clean water, access to improper education system and health facilities, poor infra-structure, increase in unemployment ratio and the list goes on. It is working selflessly for the welfare of people irrespective of their caste, color, creed or religion.

Syed Foundation is registered trust which has approval of a Non-Profit Organization with Income Tax Authorities u/s 2(36) of the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001. It also registered in FBR as a non-profit organization and the license is renewed every year. It is working on Donations, Sadqat, Zakat and Lillah. Since its formation, in 2017, it has tried to improve the conditions of people by participating in different socio-economic activities and create a positive impact on communities.

Alamgir Welfare Trust International is a social welfare organization and charity in Karachi, Pakistan which provides services in a wide variety of domains including health, education and feeding the underprivileged, etc. It was established in 1993 and is headquartered at Bahadurabad, Karachi.

Syed Foundation has been collaborating with Alamgir Welfare Trust International for the past ten years to serve the poor and needy. Some of the work done together includes:

- Provision of coolers for clean water.
- Distribution of cooked meals for the impoverished.
- Assistance with burials.
- Support for coolies at railway station who suffered during flood 2022.
- Dowry provisions.
- Educational opportunities for deserving students.

In recognition of the impactful work carried out by Syed foundation, Alamgir Welfare Trust International has officially signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), to establish partnership, collaborate on shared goals and support each other to solve the social and economic issues faced by the people.

### **3. MOU WITH AABROO EDUCATIONAL WELFARE ORGANIZATION:**

Signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with reputable NGO, Aabroo Educational Welfare Organization located in Lahore, Pakistan. Aabroo Educational Welfare Organization started in January 2003. It was registered in Lahore, under the “Voluntary Social Welfare Agencies Ordinance (XLVI of 1961)” in August 2003.

It currently educates over 5,000 poor children (51% girls) in nine schools. Students receive free education from nursery to high school, including books, uniforms, daily hot lunch, vocational training, medical assistance, and portable water. Aabroo’s mission is to educate these underprivileged children and give them hope for a better future.

Our recent partnership represents an exciting opportunity for us to leverage our strengths and resources to achieve even greater outcomes in our shared mission to transform the lives of the underprivileged children and their families.





## **ACTIVITIES DONE BY SYED FOUNDATION:**

The canvas of activities of Syed Foundation has been diversified and multifaceted. Arranging lunches, distribution of grocery and flour bags, providing medicines and other health related facilities, educational support and scholarships, service of qurbani and sadqa etc... Syed Foundation has been accomplishing these tasks with high degree of integration and dedication.

The dynamic nature of the range of social services done by Syed Foundation is as follows:

### **1. EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS:**

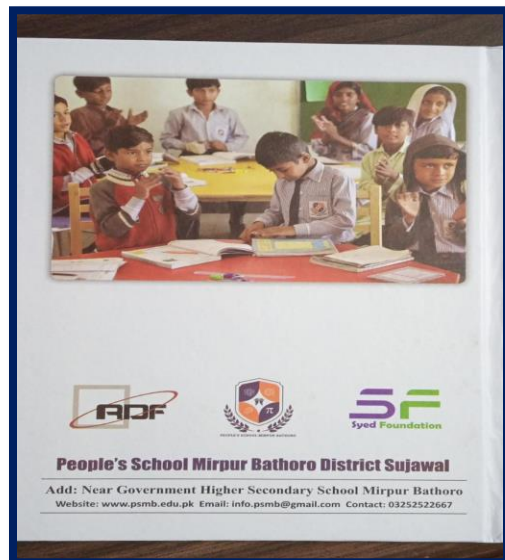
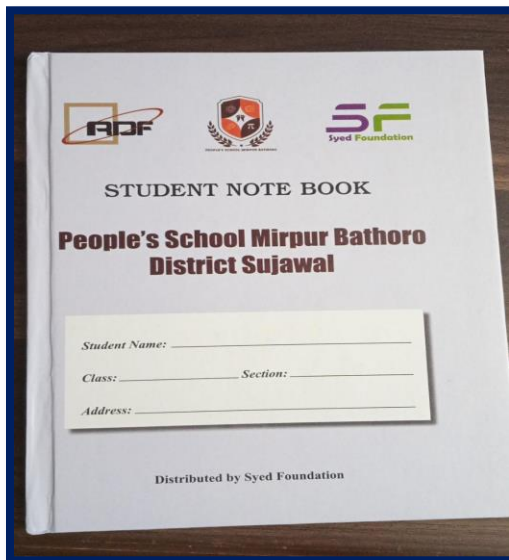
Syed Foundation mission is to transform the lives of children and their families living in poverty by providing access to quality education. In the past six months the various donations made for this purpose are as follows:

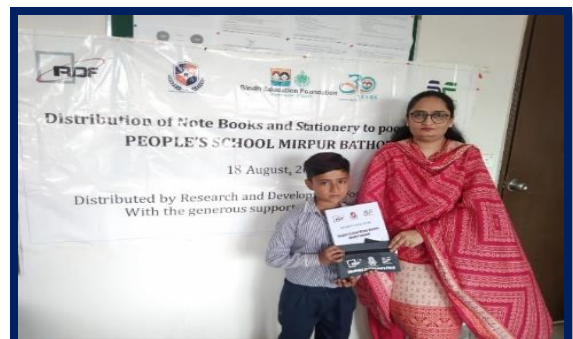
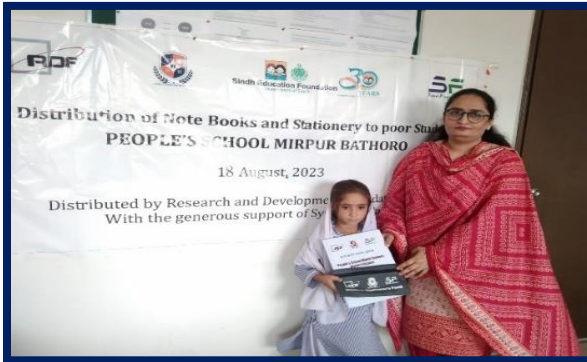
- During the year, Syed foundation has provided admission and semester fees totaling to around Rs.1,157,600/- to deserving university students, empowering them to pursue education and chart a course towards a bright future.
- This year Syed Foundation has extended school scholarships to 66 students across various schools including Habib Public School, Magnanimous Schooling, Iqra Taj School, Quill Grammar School, Zion School, M.D Public School, Little flower Academy, Educators School, SMIU, The Heaven City School and Al-Khair Academy, offering a cumulative financial support of Rs. 996,000/- This initiative underscores our commitment to fostering education accessibility and empowering students from diverse educational background.
- To empower economically disadvantaged women and to motivate them to learn valuable skills and enhance their livelihood, we covered the fees Rs. 12,500/- , so all the ladies learn at the Stitching Centre in Malook Khan, a village near Tando Allahyar.





- Stationary packs and registers, having worth of Rs. 250,000/- were distributed among students of SMIU School Karachi and Peoples School MirpurKhas and Sujawal.







- Three cupboards were given for the classes of special children in the Rehabilitation Centre of Darul Sukun.



- Given fund of Rs.49,000/- for the commencement of new school sessions, providing support to five students with new books and uniforms through our year-round scholarship program. This initiative aims to remove financial barriers to education and promote equal opportunities for all students.
- Donated Rs.100,000/- to support the education program in collaboration with Alamgir Welfare Trust International. This donation aims to provide resources such as new books and uniform to ensure that students have the necessary material as the new school session begins. This initiative aims to remove financial barriers to education and promote equal opportunities for all students.
- Contributed Rs.10,000/- towards the book publication promoting literature.

## 2. MEDICAL ASSISTANCE:

One of the primary objectives of Syed Foundation is to provide aid in terms of distribution of medicines, clearing hospital bills, help in operations etc. The details of donations made for this purpose are as follows:

- SF provides a financial aid of Rs. 300,000/- in the past six months to Omair Sana Welfare Foundation, a well-known organization treating Thalassemia patients.
- For the treatment of an especially able girl at Islamic Medical Center, Rawalpindi, Syed Foundation has provided a financial aid of Rs. 300,000/- during the past year.
- Contributed in providing a hospital bed to a bed-ridden patient.
- SF has extended vital financial support, allocating a total amount of Rs. 445,345/- to aid various patients in covering expenses for essential medicines and crucial lab tests.
- Financial support of Rs. 50,000/- was given to a patient for his essential surgery at Bantva Anis Hospital.
- Generously donated Rs.20,000/- towards the patient’s operation at Jamal Noor Hospital, making a tangible difference in the journey towards recovery and well-being.
- Generously donated Rs. 111,000/- towards the patient’s bone marrow transplant operation, making a tangible difference in the journey towards recovery and well-being.
- 70F Friends of Humanity collaborated with Syed Foundation, and made a donation of Rs. 280,000/- for the operation of a boy at Liaquat National Hospital. This joint effort aims to provide necessary medical assistance to the child.
- Provided medicines and injections worth Rs.200,000/- for an elderly patient residing at Darul Sukun Old House, courtesy by Mrs. Fatima Lakhani and Orchard Grammar School.
- Contributed Rs.150,000/- towards the critical operation of an infant child at M. Hashim Memorial Trust Hospital, courtesy by Mr. Babar Shabbir Khan.



### 3. FOOD DRIVES:

As food is the basic necessity of every human being, Syed foundation has always tried to feed the underprivileged people. For this purpose, the following activities were conducted:

- This year Syed Foundation conducted food drives every at institutions where people are residing such as Darul Sukun center for old people, Darul Sukun centre for disable children, Idarieu School for Blind and Deaf, Aashiyana House old home for women and orphanage Al-Furqan Homes worth of Rs. 2,015,000/- feeding around 10,300 people.
- Provided 50 packets of biryani of worth Rs. 11,000/- at an event on 24th November at Liyari, Karachi.
- Lunch was arranged in Mehran town in January, courtesy by Mr. S.M.Mohsin and family.
- In January Lunch and refreshments were arranged at KMC Sports Complex for the players from Baluchistan.
- Provided lunch for 75 people at the final ceremony of Blind Sports Function in May.
- Provided lunch for 100 people of worth Rs. 25,000/- at the final ceremony at KPT Stadium in May.
- Provided refreshment boxes for 35 people of worth Rs. 7,000/- at Aram Bagh in May.





#### 4. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE:

Syed foundation has contributed for financial assistance, directly addressing the urgent needs of individuals. This financial support has been instrumental in providing relief and support to those facing economic hardships. The detailed information on this contribution is as follows:

- Syed Foundation has provided consistent financial assistance to 9 families each month during this year, with a total cumulative worth of Rs. 876,000/-.
- In our project of Marriage Assistance, Rs. 107,000/- donation was given to needy families. Provided a ceiling fan as part of our marriage assistance program.
- Contributed Rs. 39,750/- for construction of roof of house for poverty-stricken families.
- Made a meaningful contribution of Rs.25 000/- to help a needy family establish a French Fries Cart, fostering self-sufficiency and economic empowerment within the community. Also contributed Rs. 10,000/- with Khas Foundation to setup a confectionary cart for a needy individual.



- Made a meaningful financial contribution of Rs. 55,000/- to support various marriage celebrations. This contribution not only bring joy to individuals but also exemplify the transformative effect of collective goodwill.
- Covered the NADRA fee of Rs. 22,000/- for a cleaner, easing a financial burden and ensuring access to essential documentation.
- Contributed wool, needles, and frames to both an elderly care facility Darul Sukun Old House Karachi and the Stitching Centre at Tando Allahyar, empowering women by providing them with the necessary resources to develop their skills and foster economic independence.





- Financial aid of Rs. 40,000/- was given to support 3 needy families.
- In response to the sweltering summer conditions, extended support to a needy family by providing them with a standing fan.

## 5. DISTRIBUTION OF GROCERY:

*"Feeding the hungry is not just a charitable act; it is a profound expression of our shared humanity and a commitment to building a world where no one goes to bed hungry."-Unknown*

Syed Foundation contribution to the provision of essential grocery bags for vulnerable communities is as follows:

- Ration bags worth Rs. 3,312,887/- were distributed among 58 families every month, courtesy by Orchard Grammar School.
- Monthly Chase grocery vouchers were distributed among 42 families, having the total worth of Rs. 256,000/-. Moreover, Syed foundation contributed Rs. 5,000/- in Inflation Relief Program with Khas Foundation to distribute flour.



- Contributed Rs. 30,000/- over the period of past twelve months in order to provide boxes of Porridge and Cerelac for children and senior citizens residing at Darul Sukun.



- Two Grocery bags worth of Rs. 3, 000/- each and one bag of Rs. 7,500/- were given to deserving families, each month throughout the year.
- Received a generous in-kind donation of 100 Packets of tea of worth Rs.90,000/- . It was donated among needy individuals and different institutes including Ehsas-e-Insaniyat, Darulsukun Old House, Aashiyana Trust, KSF and Sweet Home. Also received a generous in-kind donation of 50 Packets of tea of worth Rs. 45,000/-. It was donated among needy individuals and different institutes including Darulsukun Old House, Aashiyana Trust and Stitching Centre Tando Allahyar.



Eggs worth of Rs. 5,000/- were given for the old ladies residing at Aashiyana Trust.

- Donated 10kg flour to support the humanitarian efforts of NGO Ehsas-e-Bashar, demonstrating commitment to assist communities in need and fostering collaboration for greater impact.
- Gave a gift of some eatables including 20 dozen eggs, 20 porridge boxes, 8 cartons of milk, 20 boxes of biscuits and 10 kg sugar for the residents of DarulSukun Kashmir Road with the courtesy of Dr.Qazi Muhammad Firoze.



- Contributed 5 vouchers of Rs. 750/- each to aid in the purchase of 5kg flour as part of Food drive.
- Donated 36 liters of milk and 6 dozen eggs for breakfast at the orphanage Al-Furqan Homes, ensuring nutritious meals for the children in need.



- Provided two cartons of milk to Darul Sukun, courtesy by (Late) Mr. Sikander Ahmed and family.
- Received generous in-kind donation from Mr. & Mrs. Ather Hussain of 20 bags of flour, each weighing 10kg. These were distributed among the institutes;
  - i) Orphanage Al-Furqan Homes.
  - ii) Darul Sukun Old House.
  - iii) Darul Sukun Institute for Disable Children.
  - iv) Idarieu School for Blind and Deaf.
  - v) Old Women Homes Aashiyana Trust.
  - vi) Bint-e-Fatima Old House for Women.
  - vii) Maids and servants employed in different households.

## 6. HAND PUMPS:

*Allah says in Quran “Indeed, the men who practice charity and the women who practice charity and [they who] have loaned Allah a goodly loan – it will be multiplied for them, and they will have a noble reward.”- [57:18]*

In impoverished regions, communities often lack access to reliable water sources, leading to waterborne diseases and other health-related issues. The installation of hand pumps seeks to mitigate these challenges by providing a sustainable and accessible water supply.

The hand pump installation project focuses on identifying and addressing specific areas with high water scarcity and limited access to clean water. Target locations are chosen based on a thorough needs assessment, considering factors such as population density, existing water infrastructure, and health indicators.

85 hand pumps worth of Rs. 2,125,000/- were installed, in collaboration with Alamgir Welfare Trust International, to help in supply of water among poor families residing in Mityari, Larkana, Khairpur and Mirpur Khas. Also installed two hand pumps of worth Rs.100, 000 /- in collaboration with RDF, in village of Tando Adam, District Sanghar. This initiative has brought clean and accessible water to community in need.

In conclusion, the hand pump installation project represents a crucial step towards addressing water challenges in impoverished areas. By combining technological solutions with community engagement, this initiative contributes to sustainable development and improved quality of life for vulnerable populations.







## **7. WINTER DRIVE:**

This winter, Syed Foundation successfully contributed to providing warmth and comfort to those in need by distributing blankets, jackets, coats, shawls, shoes and socks worth of Rs. 1,883,250/- . The distribution details are as follows:

- Blankets were distributed among underprivileged families in Tando Allahyar-Sindh, Tando Adam-Sindh, Village of Goundariro District Khairpur-Sindh, Larkana-Sindh, Sukkur-Sindh, Hyderabad-Sindh, Sujawal-Sindh, Peshawar-KPK, Quetta-Baluchistan, Kalam-KPK, Abbottabad-KPK and Nathiagali-KPK.
- Received in-kind donation of 210 blankets, from Mr. Khaldoon Raja. These were donated among the needy families of interior Sindh.
- Blankets and Jackets were sent to NGO Aabroo Educational Welfare Organization in Lahore, and were distributed among underprivileged families in Punjab.
- Mr. David Vincent, representative of Christian community living in Rawalpindi, received and distributed the warm blankets among the needy Christian families. Moreover, blankets were distributed among the needy Christian families in Karachi.
- In the spirit of caring for our community blankets were distributed among the hardworking security guards of different Universities, Sports venues, certain Government offices and clubs in Karachi.
- The house helps workers, drivers and homeless people living on roadsides living in Karachi, have received blankets, providing them with warmth and comfort.
- Furthermore, welfare institutes in Karachi, like Darul Sukun Kashmir Road, Darul Sukun Old House, Idarieu School for blind and deaf, Aashiyana Trust and Abbasi Shaheed Hospital, received and distributed the warm blankets.
- In the heart of Karachi, blankets have gently settled in the hands of those in need across diverse Karachi neighborhoods, North Nazimabad, North Karachi, New Karachi, different sectors of Orangi Town, Malir Cantt, Mehmoodabad, Cantt station area, Gulshan-e-Iqbal, Gulistan-e-Jauhar, DHA, Ahsanabad, Baloch Colony and Gulshan-e-Maymaar.
- Poor students of People’s School Mirpur Batholo District Sujawal and Badin Madressah received jackets.
- Furthermore, jackets were distributed among children in Peshawar-KPK, Larkana-Sindh, Kalam-KPK and Nathiagali-KPK.
- Distributed shoes and socks among children in Peshawar-KPK, Lahore-Punjab, Kalam-KPK and Abbottabad-KPK.
- Shawls distributed at Darul Sukun Old House M.A Jinnah Road and Tando Allahyar, extending warmth and comfort to those in need.

- Syed Foundation gratefully a generous received in-kind donation of 283 coats, having cost of Rs.283, 000/- We subsequently distributed these warm essentials to individuals in need in Abbotabad, Disable Centre Peshawar and Kalaam, Bajour and Nathiagali KPK, creating a positive impact.











## 8. Sadqah-e-Jariah:

- Contributed Rs. 40,000/- in construction of a Masjid-e-Ibrahim at Scheme 33, Karachi, courtesy by Dr. Zubaida Shahwar.
- Contributed Rs. 80,000/- in construction of a Masjid-e-Ibrahim at Scheme 33, Karachi by Alamgir Welfare Trust International, for Sawab-e-Jaria of (Late) Syed Hamid Ali Jafri and (Late) Syeda Razia Rifat Jafri.
- Provided ten stools to enhance seating facilities at the orphanage Sweet Home, promoting a more comfortable and inclusive environment for the children.



- As part of our commitment to Sadqa-e-Jariah, a concept of ongoing charity in Islam, we undertook the installation of a solar panel in a Masjid. The total Cost for its installation was Rs. 175,000/-. The installation of the solar panel not only provides immediate benefits to the Masjid in terms of energy efficiency and cost savings but also serves as a long-term investment in sustainability. By reducing reliance on conventional energy sources, the initiative contributes to mitigating environmental impact and promoting a greener future.

## 9. TRAINING INSTITUTE FOR STITCHING:

The stitching center has been established in Tando Allah Yar, Sindh, in collaboration with Research & Development Foundation. The women are given training, after which they will be provided with an interest-free loan to start their business. The seed money for the loan scheme is 1.5 million rupees.





## 10. SADQAH:

*Prophet Muhammad (SallallahuAlaihiWasallam) Said: “Sadaqah wipes out sins like water extinguishes fire.” – [Tirmidhi]*

Syed Foundation provides service of doing Sadqah in form of slaughtering of animal or provision of grocery bags. This year **28** goats have been slaughtered, and the meat was distributed to poor people.

## 11. HUMANITARIAN AID FOR GAZA:

*You don't need to be Muslim to care and pray for Gaza. You just need to be Human.*

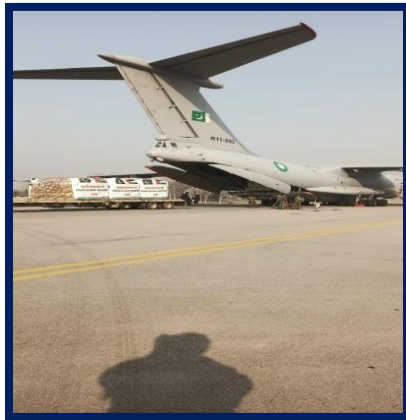
The Palestinian territories, particularly the West Bank and Gaza Strip, continue to face complex challenges, including political instability, economic hardship, and limited access to essential services. The aid provided is geared towards alleviating these challenges and fostering a path towards sustainable development.

In response to the urgent humanitarian situation in Gaza, Syed Foundation in collaboration with the 70-F Friends of Humanity Foundation, have been able to send three consignments of essential donation to Palestine.

### a) FIRST PHASE (NOVEMBER'23):

During the first phase of the Palestine Aid Project cycle in November, we made significant contributions to the community. Our donations included Blankets and Medical Supplies worth of Rs. 6,478,444/-. This phase was crucial in providing immediate relief to those in need, especially as winter approached and medical necessities were a priority.





**b) SECOND PHASE (APRIL'24):**

In the second phase of our donation cycle, which took place in April, we focused on food security and donated Rice and Ready-made Food worth of Rs. 2,000,000/- . This effort was aimed at ensuring that the affected families had access to essential food supplies.



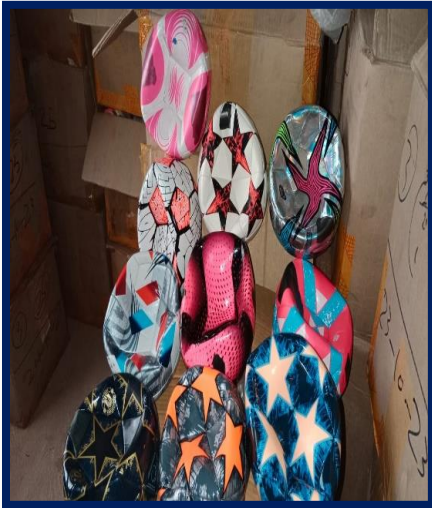


### c) THIRD PHASE (MAY'24):

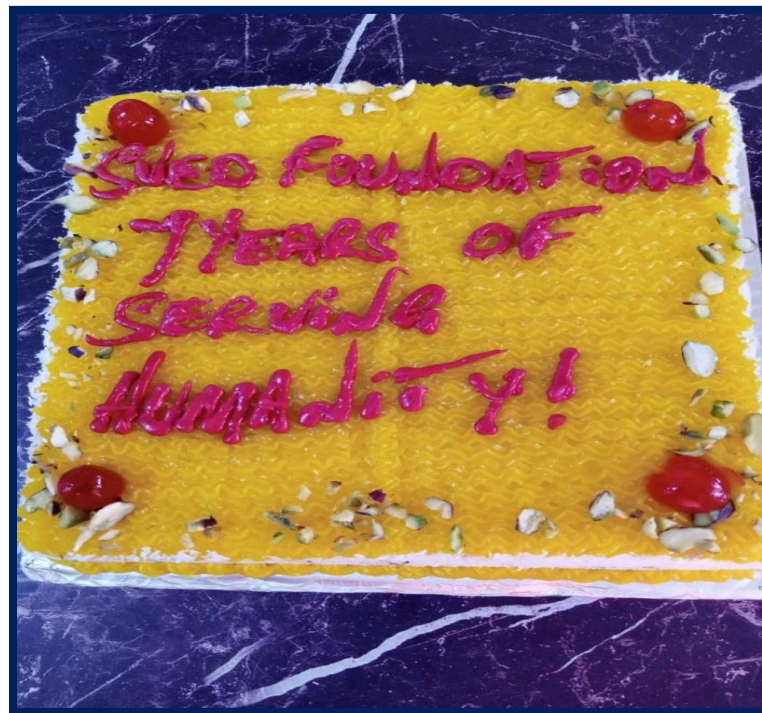






## **15. ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION OF SYED FOUNDATION:**



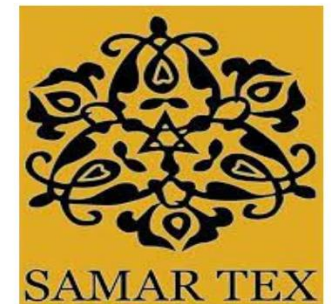
